The Canadian Government continues to stand with Ukraine as the war with Russia continues. Since February, the government has worked with the international community to support Ukraine while holding Russia accountable for their actions. This has meant placing economic sanctions on the Russian government and various Russian elites.

Canada has also provided Ukraine with a \$120 million dollar loan to help stabilize their economy. In addition to closing our airspace to Russian aircraft, the Canadian government has also banned all crude oil imports from Russia. Some Russian broadcast channels are banned from airing in Canada. Sanctioned Russians will no longer be able to enter Canada.

The Canadian military and government will remain united with our allies in helping Ukraine combat Russian tyranny. Whether this means sending soldiers or aid, we stand with the Ukrainian people. Slava Ukraini!
